Rose Free Lutheran Church Council Unapproved Meeting Minutes August 27, 2024

Meeting Called to Order by President Tim Fugleberg. Pastor Tod Erickson opened with a devotion on God's Will by Paul David Tripp and prayer. Those present were Sue and Mike Rudebusch, Jeremy Anderson, Kurt Osweiler, Cody Schumann, Jon Johnson, Pastor Todd Erickson, and Tim Fugleberg. Secretary's report was read and placed on file. Treasurer's report was read by Sue Rudebusch. Kurt Osweiler moved to accept and 2nd by Jeremy Anderson.

Old Business:

FLBC Scholarship: It was discussed that we will keep the \$2,000/semester scholarship as is, but also to establish a scholarship fund that can be given to throughout the year. Amounts would be approved by the council a few times a year, but the intent would be that all dollars that come in would go out to the current student(s). If larger amounts were to be given, the council would discuss if some should be retained for future semesters.

Intern: Tim will reach out to James Molstre to let him know that Rose has had discussions about potentially having another intern. He will also check with Spruce to gauge their interest. Our next Parish meeting is November.

FLY Convention: Fly will be next June 30th through July 5th . Early registration must be done by November 21st for the lowest cost registration. Kurt will be connecting to the parents of kids who will be old enough to go.

Insurance: Tim reported that the church deductible is increasing effective October 1st .

Christian Education: Joyce submitted a quarterly financial summary. No summer team came for VBS, so expenses were lower.

Survey: Pastor Todd and Joyce have been working on a survey to be sent out to the congregation. It was read and discussed.

Ambassador Publications: Pastor Todd received a communication from the AFLC publishing regarding reprinting of materials. Kurt Osweiler moved and Mike Rudebusch 2nd to send \$100 to help with the printing costs.

Pastor's Report: There will be a confirmation meeting coming up with this year's confirmation students. The young explorers lock in was held and had 12 attend. The group will range between 10-20 this year. Release time is still being discussed amongst the Roseau Ministerial. Pastor Todd discussed that he is considering a once/month Wednesday evening service. Missionaries Paul and Becky Abel will be at the church the evening of October 13th. Shirley Kupper's funeral will be Saturday August 31st. Meeting Adjourned with the Lord's Prayer
