New Business:

Greg Dahl to allow the transfer of money from the building fund if it is needed. Motion carried. Parish Council met on Nov.27th and discussed Pastor salary raise. Pastor Todd would like to have an extra week of vacation in lieu of a salary increase. Motion by Greg Dahl 2nd David Grahn to accept this proposal. Motion carried. Discussion on church cleaning... At the Nov.27th Mission aid mtg it was decided to get someone to help with general cleaning such as vacuuming, bathrooms, dusting etc. Sue Suess has agreed to come and clean every other month with the option to change as we see fit. She is paid \$55 each time and this will be paid from Mission Aid. A cleaning list has been printed in the annual report-when it is your month just check to see if anything needs a little extra help.
