Why We're Here

"You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled by men. You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven. Matthew 5:13-16

These verses got me to thinking about a couple of stories I've heard throughout my life. You see sometimes I forget why I'm here and what Jesus has done for me. Coming off a blessed Lent and Easter season may these two stories comfort us in who we are in Christ and challenge us to live out our lives for Him. May they also encourage us to share the story of Jesus Christ's love for us and for our fellow man.

Story #1—There was a dangerous seacoast where shipwrecks often occurred. Some residents of the area erected a small life-saving station. The few devoted people who manned it had only one boat, but they kept a constant watch over the sea. They saved many lives, and the little place soon became widely known. Other people joined the local residents and gave of their time and money to expand the operation. Soon a beautiful new building was erected. Later, when a large shipwreck occurred, survivors were brought into the attractive new building, which had become a clubhouse. The place became dirty, and some of the plush furniture was soiled. At the next meeting many of the members felt that the life-saving activities were becoming a hindrance to the social life of the organization. Those who disagreed were told to begin another station down the beach, so they did. The years passed, and history repeated itself. In time the seacoast had a number of exclusive clubs dotting the shore, but they had forgotten their original purpose.

This is a parable. A church must never lose its life-saving mission. It's so easy to become sidetracked and self-serving. Let's be faithful in our witness lest our churches neglect their calling to rescue the lost.

Story #2—Mark and Alice Westlind and their family were missionaries with the Evangelical Covenant church in Colombia. Here is an excerpt from one of their prayer letters years ago.... "Driving through Christmas traffic, fighting the drizzle rain, I chanced on a 4-year-old little girl. She was wet and cold and shaking. Here clothes were ragged, her hair was matted, and her nose was running. She walked between the cars at the stoplight, washing headlights because she was too short to wash windshields. A few gave her coins, others honked at her to get away from their vehicles." You may admire the honesty of their next sentence in the letter.... "As I drove away only some 50 cents poorer, I raged at God for the situation. 'God, how could You just stand by, helpless?'" The missionary concluded, "Later that evening, God came to me softly with that still small voice and responded not in like kind to my rage, but with tenderness, 'I have done something. I created you.'"

Jesus came as light to our sin-darkened, cruel, unfair world. As we respond with compassion and goodness to suffering people, we proclaim His life-changing power. We can't solve all the world's problems, but we can bear witness to the Light and bring glory to the Father. Jesus encouraged and challenged us to do so as we read in Matthew 5:13-16. May we be faithful and live for Jesus, for that's what really matters.

<u>Called to Order:</u> Meeting called to order by Tim Fugleberg.

Devotions by Pastor Todd taken from Matthew 6:26. Shared with council how "God the Father watches over us all", and how valuable we are to God.

Minutes from October 2024 were read, reviewed and carried. Motioned to accept by Kurt Osweiler and seconded by Jeremy Anderson.

Treasurer's Report: A typed report by Sue Rudebusch for Jan/Feb reported by Tim F. Accepted by council. Primavera project raised \$21,628.03. Motions to carry: Cody Schumann and followed by Jeremy Anderson.

- -Scholarship FLBC cost evaluated per student. Currently \$2000.00 per semester for a total of \$8000.00 depending on number of applicants. Funds presented September and January.


<u>Pastor's Report:</u>
